

Impact of Pupil Premium Spending 2015-16

KS2 Attainment

As a result of the pupil premium spend last year, which included interventions, purchase of high quality resources and training for core skills, 2016 results demonstrate a diminishing gap in attainment (children reaching the age related expectation) between Disadvantaged in school and other pupils nationally in reading, maths and combined reading, writing and maths.

KS2 Progress

Progress for disadvantaged children remains below other nationally.

Although there is a gap in the progress made by children in school and the progress seen nationally, high quality teaching improvements and targeted interventions are ensuring that the progress gap is diminishing across school over time.

KS1 Attainment

As a result of the spend on pupil premium in KS1, including interventions in core subject areas, breakfast club and learning mentor intervention, the gap between disadvantaged children and others nationally has decreased in reading and writing. Although the gap in maths has widened and this is an issue that is addressed in next year's plan.
